**ARTS ~ Carol Yeaman, Chairman**

**Small Club Category**

**Best Single Project: Kanawha Woman's Club**

This club encouraged participation in the GFWC photography contests by purchasing disposable cameras and circulating them among the members. After 5 months, the film was developed and the photos displayed at the club's arts and crafts show.

**Best Overall: GFWC Sycamore Woman's Club**

This club provided members who served as hostesses for the Richmond Symphony Designer House; viewed exhibits and attended lectures at the Virginia Museum; enjoyed arts and crafts activities at members' homes; and held classes in chair caning and belly dancing.

**Medium Club Category**

**Best Single Project: Varina Woman's Club**

This club's members contributed yarn and shared the work on an afghan that won a Blue Ribbon at the Virginia State Fair; and the club later raffled it as a fundraiser.
