The members cleaned out their houses and donated \$40, 811 worth of furniture, household goods and clothing to Thrift for Life with proceeds going to the Massey Cancer Center. They donated an additional \$25 to Cancer Dancer. They held a Yoga class program with a donation to the teacher of \$25. They volunteered to pack backpacks for food for children to have over the weekend which was shut down after 3 months due to Covid. They sponsored and supported a single mother who was a recovering drug addict with funds for food, clothing, and bills for her and her 15-year-old daughter.
